Coast to Coast Prayers for Peace
Archbishop Tartaglia has encouraged Catholics in the Archdiocese to pray the Rosary as part of a unique day of prayer around the coast.

The "Rosary on the Coast Campaign" is a new initiative encouraging people to gather on the last Sunday of April at 3pm and pray the Rosary for life, faith and peace.

Parishes are being invited to organise a gathering at a coastal area suitable to themselves. And already groups have signed up to pray at Ardrossan, Largs, Troon, Prestwick and Ayr while St Martin's in Renton will participate at Levensgrove Park in Dumbarton. Archbishop Tartaglia has backed the campaign. He said: "I am delighted to see the initiative of praying the Rosary round the coast spring up from the grass roots of the Church. It shows the depth of faith of our lay people and the strength of their devotion to Our Lady...".

GOING INTO HOSPITAL


- ◆ Contact your own priest beforehand if someone is going into hospital re major illness/operation/elderly. The person can then receive the Sacrament of the Sick before going into hospital
- ◆ When admitted to hospital ask that your Religion be placed in your Personal File. Let the nurse know if you have already had the Sacrament of the Sick and they will make a note of that.
- ◆ For those who are in-patients, ask the Ward Staff Nurse to contact and request a visit for the Catholic patient by the Catholic Chaplaincy Team. Or phone 0141 201 1100.
- ◆ If a relative is dying the family need to ask the Ward Staff Nurse to have the Chaplain paged
- ◆ Parishioners who are elderly or who have a serious illness are advised to carry with them an I.D. Saying they are Catholic e.g. "I AM A CATHOLIC. In the event of an emergency hospital admission please notify a Catholic hospital chaplain/ priest."
- ◆ There is Mass every Sunday at 4.00 pm. In The Sanctuary of The Queen Elizabeth University Hospital. (Check with Ward Staff).


