Correspondence FYI: Fr Allan's Email to Archdiocese:

The parish of St Brigid Toryglen was founded in 1955. The (original) parish of Holy Cross was founded in 1886. In 2030 and 2036 the parishes will be celebrating their 75<sup>th</sup> and 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversaries respectively. Having formed PPCs and PFCs in both parishes, we are looking at a five year plan in St Brigid's and a ten year plan in Holy Cross to prepare for these celebrations... There are a number of ideas that we'd like to explore, and everything is likely to cost money. Therefore, I would like to start a Celebration Fund in each parish to prepare for these events. I request that these Celebration Funds should be considered for Approved Fundraising status. (ie not taxed by Archdiocese) The Reply received:

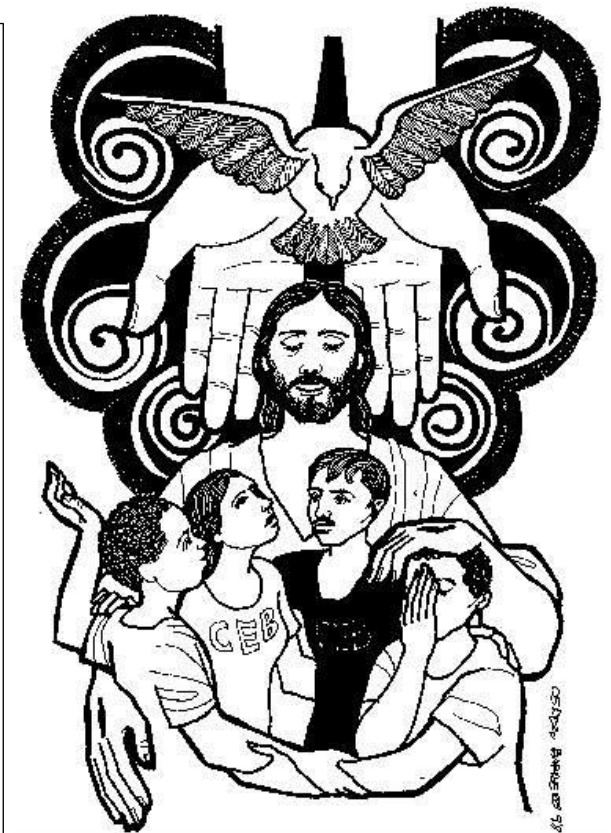
