Today's celebration of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ gives us a chance to reflect on our parish celebration of Mass and the way in which we show due reverence and honour to the Lord's Sacramental Presence. When we arrive in the Church, we are invited to genuflect before entering our seats. We are also encouraged to spend some time in quiet prayer to the Lord present in the Tabernacle. It is always a good idea to try to support each other by keeping our conversations out in the porch or outside so as not to distract those who are praying. This also applies at the end of Mass as we are leaving.

While we tend to have our own seat, please consider moving closer to the sanctuary and the middle of the church. Sitting, standing and kneeling together provides a greater sense of being part of the Body of Christ. During Mass we are urged to full, conscious and active participation in the celebration of the liturgy. When we sing, when we listen, when we join in the responses, all these are helps to our appreciation of the great love of God and Sacrifice of Christ that is celebrated at Mass.

When we come forward to receive Holy Communion, it is always with respect and gratitude. Some kind of sign of our devotion, especially a bow, while the person in front is receiving Communion is a good practice. If receiving Holy Communion in the hand, please remember to do so with an appreciation of who it is that we are receiving. A kneeler is provided in St Brigid's for those who prefer to kneel to receive Holy Communion, one will be provided in Holy Cross at the Lady Altar side of the sanctuary.

Receiving Holy Communion in both the Body and the Blood of Christ can help us see more clearly that we are fulfilling the Lord's command to eat and drink. We can never dip the host into the chalice, consuming the Precious Blood should be done straight from the chalice to prevent any danger of spillage.

Finally, we have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Thursday and Saturday mornings in Holy Cross, why not make some time to spend with the Lord?
